For the love of a Masai

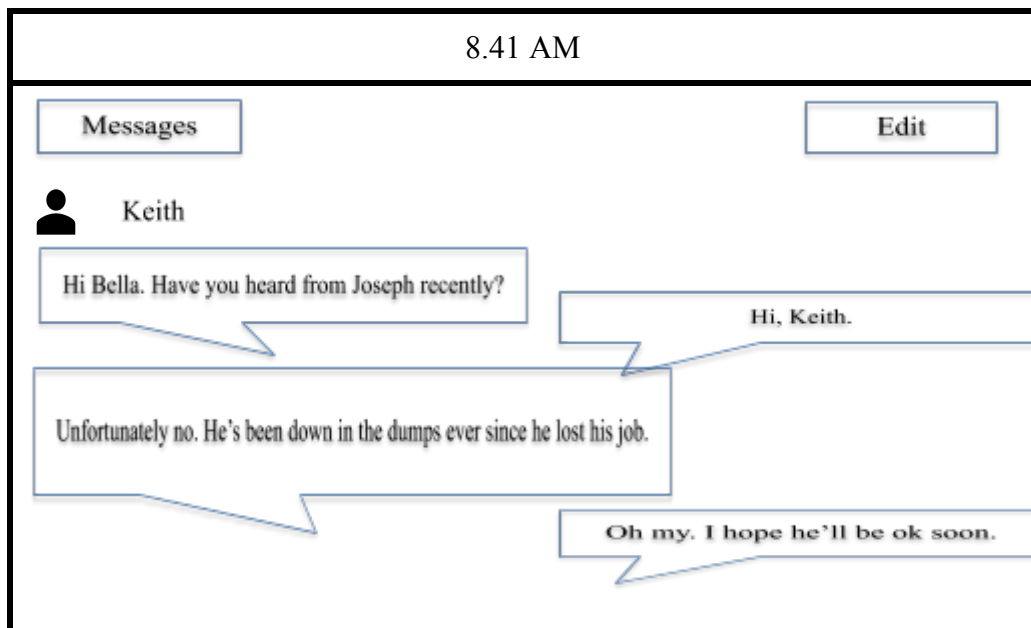

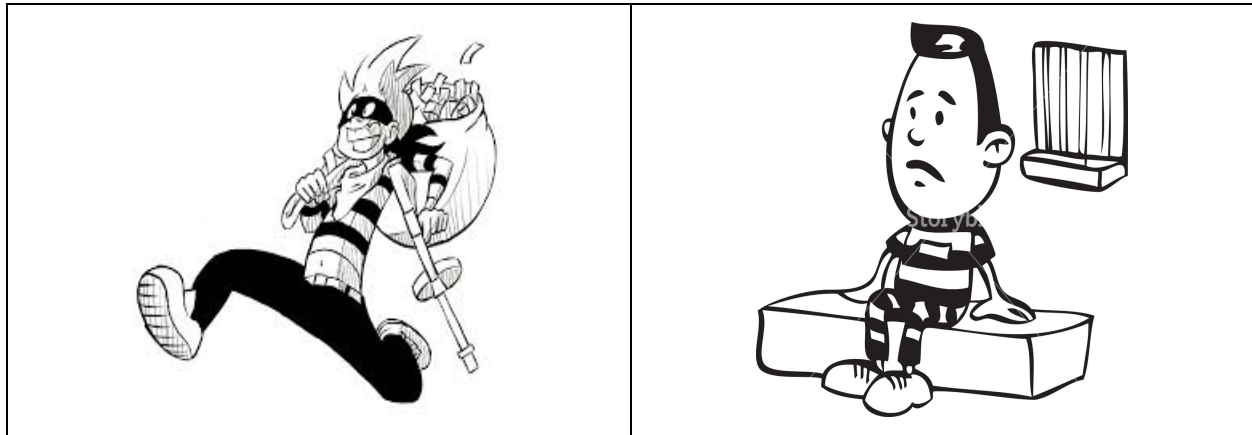



	<p>To lose or maintain weight, should you avoid carbohydrates at all cost, or just certain ones?</p> <p>Our dietitians reveal the facts behind common carbohydrates myths :</p>
<p>Myth No. 1 : Carbohydrates make you gain weight</p> <p>People often say that carbohydrates are fattening, but complex carbohydrates, like whole grains, are not. Even though eating carbohydrates raise your blood glucose and prompts your body to release insulin, it is the type and quantity of the carbohydrates you eat - not carbohydrates themselves - that cause weight gain.</p> <p>Avoid refined carbohydrates like chips, crackers and pretzel.</p>	<p>Myth No.2. : Only white foods contain carbohydrates</p> <p>There seems to be a lot of confusion about which foods contain carbohydrates. People often think only rice, bread, pasta, potatoes, sweets and sugary drinks are carbohydrates. There are actually a long complete list of high-carbohydrate foods which include :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Sweet potatoes ● Corn ● Peas ● Oats, quinoa and whole wheat ● Yogurt and milk ● Fruits
<p>Myth No. 3 : All white foods should be avoided</p> <p>It is true that white foods like processed grains and sweets are higher on the glycemic index, quickly raise blood sugar and cause inflammation. But other carbohydrate-rich foods which are considered white can be essential to good health.</p> <p>For example, potatoes are great sources of potassium, fibre and Vitamin C. Cauliflower, beans and apples are also nutrient- rich white food.</p>	<p>Myth No. 4 : Fruits are bad because they are high in carbohydrates</p> <p>People often say that fruits have too much sugar in them. The truth is that fruits are dense in nutrients. They boast fructose, fibre, vitamins, minerals and phytonutrients.</p> <p>Fresh or frozen fruits are recommended over fruit juice. Fruit juice is more concentrated in fructose but lacks fibre</p>

- 1 Rosli is a freelance disc jockey (DJ) and his job is technology-related. He also gets to use the latest and coolest gadgets in the market.
- 2 His radio is not just a radio. The sound system is connected to the Internet and to his desktop computer. Rosli also taps into his CDs which are loaded into the hard drive of his computer. No rustling through drawers for the original CDs ! 5
- 3 Technology has really changed and enhanced the way a person works, rests, and plays. For example, there are television broadcasts to mobile phones. There are also hand-held computers that connect to the Internet via Wi-Fi and within minutes we can watch a news channel, a sports channel, or a movie channel! Now, that's cool. Young children , too, are all technology-savvy. They are either busy playing Playstation, surfing the Internet, updating information in their Facebook, going on to Twitter, or watching 3D cartoons from their HD plasma television with their headphones on! However, they have sacrificed their hours of playing hide-and-seek and traditional games such as *congkak* and *wau* . 10
- 4 With technology, Rosli and his family never have to stop and ask for directions if they are taking a road trip or if they are lost. This is because the car has a Global Positioning System (GPS) that does the navigating or they can refer to a social traffic and navigation app – Waze. 15
- 5 Then, there is the 'smartphone' which functions more as a computer than a mobile phone. This helps Rosli a lot as it lets him email, web surf, open Word documents, and even make free long-distance calls if there's a Wi-Fi connection available. It also has a memory-card slot, so Rosli can load music into it and connect it to his wireless headphones. 20
- 6 Furthermore, Rosli's 78-year-old father is thrilled to stay in touch with friends and family around the world via e-mail by using his laptop. 25
- 7 Rosli's eldest child, Farhan, is studying to be a chef and spent four months in Italy learning about Italian cuisine. With a laptop, webcam and Internet phone, he

kept in touch with his friends and relatives.

8 Finally, technology runs Rosli's home security and surveillance system,
 sending an alert to his mobile device if the alarm is triggered. This system allows 30
 him to log on and monitor from any location to immediately know if something
 was amiss.

9 Technology is fast advancing and we need to absorb these advances into our
 daily lives. The line between work, play, and family is blurring because technology
 allows us to do many things anywhere, anytime. Many resent the pressure 35
 technology brings, but I can't imagine life without it.
