

- 3 A former security guard, Belvin immediately noticed the scruffy man in a tan baseball hat walking quickly down the aisles. The man did not look like he was shopping. Then, Belvin heard the cry of a little girl, "Somebody help me!"
- 4 In the LEGO aisle, a ten-year-old girl had been pushing her two-year-old brother in a cart. Now Belvin overheard her frantically telling someone that a man had just grabbed her backside. "Was he wearing a black shirt and a tan baseball hat?" Belvin asked her. When she said yes, he took off to find him.
- 5 Heading towards the front of the store, he spotted the man about 30 metres ahead 20 walking rapidly towards the door. As Belvin closed in on him, the man started running.
