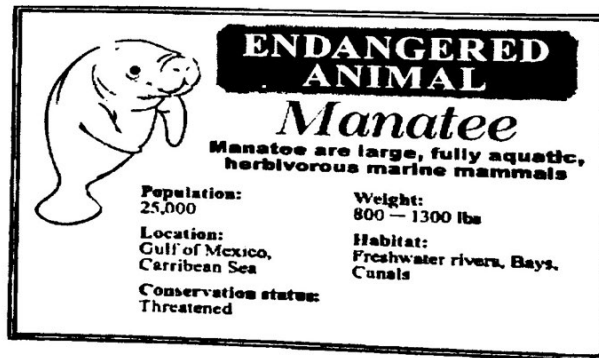

**The Nazca Lines**

The Nazca Lines (0) are a series of large ancient geoglyphs in the Nazca Desert, in southern Peru. The largest figures are about 370 metre long. The area of the Peruvian desert (9) \_\_\_\_\_ which the Nazca Lines were drawn is called the *Pampa Colorado* (Red Plain). It is 15 miles wide and runs some 37 miles parallel to the Andes and the Pacific Ocean. The desert is not sandy, but made (10) \_\_\_\_\_ dark red surface stones and soil with lighter-coloured subsoil beneath. The lines were created by clearing away the darker upper layer to reveal the lighter subsoil.

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**Ways to Spot and Avoid Scams**

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For any avid movie streamers, receiving Netflix emails about what to watch is common. Hence, a new message prompting to update account information may look common – especially when it begins with the familiar red Netflix logo on top. However, the urgency that the message carries – “Please update your subscription details, or your membership will suspended within 48 hours.” – should be good enough red flag to notify users that it is indeed a phishing scam attempt. 27

Such common phishing emails and even WhatsApp messages these days, are engineered to trick recipients into providing credit card and debit card numbers, bank details or even Netflix password. 28  Yet, not all users are cautious enough to avoid befalling into these criminal hands. Without much caution, the banking account information is keyed into false website will go to fraudsters, allowing ‘legal’ money withdrawals and transactions.

It is utmost important to always be wary as no respectable company or government department will simply demand you to confirm your identity by filling out forms, often accessible by clicking an attached hyperlink. Phishing usually redirects users to a phony website to input information, and often look almost identical to official websites of impersonated companies. 29  Sometimes, they will give a much more alarming notification like someone is trying to access your account or notify you about a huge sum of unknown transaction.

In addition, what is currently trending today is ‘vishing’ or ‘voice phishing’. 30.  Some would prompt the victims to make certain transactions in order to solve whatever problems they are accused of doing. Sometimes, victims are asked to follow a set of instructions online on their computers, before the computers are taken control by these evil scammers. Either way, victims usually are cheated a significant amount of money.

Surprisingly, seniors are not the only ones that fall victims to scammers. Despite being born in high-tech world, members of Generation Z (born in the late 1990s and early 2000s) are also falling for vishing and online scams. 31.  Some even fell for tricky advertisements that said they were entitled for certain government financial aid or free cosmetic products.

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Notwithstanding, you do not really need to unplug and return to pre-digital age to save yourself. Setting strong password can prevent becoming scam victims. 32.  Besides, double your effort by opting for two-factor authentication for banking-related apps. Having a one-time code sent to your mobile devices can really help ensure account security.

Its mobile-first approach appeals to the tech-savvy younger generation.

**C- MUDAH.MY**

Malaysia's largest marketplace for buying and selling second-hand items and it offers wide range of categories from vehicles to real estate, user-friendly platform, and the ability to find good deals on used items. However, buyers are not protected because there is no rating system to record successful purchases thus opting for cash on delivery (COD) is the best assurance you can get before making payment.

**D- CAROUSELL**

A classifieds marketplace where users can buy and sell new and used items, ranging from fashion to electronics. Health and beauty products tend to be popular. Unlike Mudah.my, this

platform enforces a rating system to ensure buyers get a secured purchasing experience. Besides, it has its own payment system, on which money will be withheld until buyers check they items they get. Buyers also have the ability to negotiate prices directly with sellers.

**E- ZALORA**

Zalora is a leading online fashion and lifestyle platform in Malaysia. Unlike local online shopping platforms, Zalora provides exclusive deals on international and local fashion brands, easy return policies, and curated collections. They cater to fashion enthusiasts looking for trendy and high-quality apparel. While prices are sometimes more expensive than local retailers, during sales, buyers can save up to 70% on old stocks. Despite discounts, any items you purchase are definitely genuine.

**F- E-BAY**

While not as dominant as local platforms, it remains popular for niche products and international purchases. It also has accessed to international sellers, availability of rare and unique items, and a trusted platform for global transactions. However, be ready to pay hefty shipping fees as most sellers are based in western countries and some even reluctant to ship to Malaysia.
