On the Indonesian island of Sulawesi, the distinctive looking Maleo bird is under threat. Female Maleo birds lay and then bury their eggs in nests that they create in the sand. The females then leave. The sand keeps the eggs warm, which helps the eggs develop. The problem is, the eggs are often dug up and eaten by predators, and now only 5,000 of the birds remain. To protect the Maleos, the Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS), funded by National Geographic magazine, has been working to preserve the nest sites. Since 2001, the WCS has released over 4,000 chicks into the wild. In the future, the group hopes to safeguard both the Maleos' nesting beaches and their rainforest habitat.

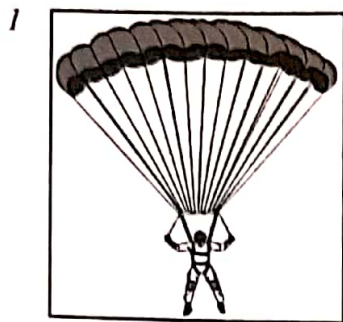

March 2nd looked like a good day to go paragliding. At a local flying site, Melissa, a 16-year-old licensed paraglider, checked the forecast. Although there were a few cloud patches in the sky, the wind was favourable. She unpacked her paraglider wing and laid it out on the ground. 5
Going through the pre-flight procedures to ensure that everything was in order, she checked to see that the lines of her paraglider were free from tangles. Then, she put on her harness and helmet.

2 Melissa lifted her wing directly above her head. With one more adjustment to 10
the brake lines, she was ready to go. She ran to the edge of the cliff, took a step and felt the ground beneath her fall away. She was in the air. Feeling the wind beneath her wing, she leaned back, relaxed and looked down. The sight of tiny figures moving slowly far below never failed to thrill her. The breeze caressed her face and birds flew gracefully by. Melissa had been paragliding almost 100 times and yet each flight 15
was different.

3 After flying for 15 minutes, Melissa decided to land on a spot next to a rice 20
field. It was much smaller than most landing zones, but it was possible. Suddenly, she began falling at an alarming speed. She had touched down there successfully on a few previous occasions. Would she be able to this time? Her paraglider was not catching the wind in the way that it needed to. She had been in a similar situation before so she quickly pulled her lines. This was something she had been taught to do in her training. This time, however, the wing did not respond.

4 If you asked anyone in the paragliding club about the characteristic they 25
most associated with Melissa, the chances are they would say determination. But what could she do now? She struggled to control the wing as she was being thrown in all directions. It was like being tossed around inside a washing machine. She remembered her instructor describing an ordeal he had once been through and now understood why he had used this image. She made a series of rapid turns which had no effect. 30

5 Two years before, when paragliding with her instructor, Melissa had managed to get herself down unharmed in the midst of a sudden storm. Melissa's instructor prided himself on the fact that, with his support, his trainees always landed safely. Melissa's natural ability struck him as being unusual, however. And even more noticeable was the calmness she showed. That was then, though. Now, the ground was moving fast towards her and she could see the rice field getting ever closer. The villagers working in the field started to look up and point. Flapping the wing was one way of slowing down to land but it was too late now for that. Directly below her, she could see clumps of sharp bamboo. A short distance away, near the edge of the field, there was a two-storey farm building that she wanted to avoid.
