He was always repairing stuff or making his toys last longer especially the ones he loved. When he was six, he chopped the legs of the dining table in half so he could sit at it more comfortably. He got punished for that but he learned an important lesson. By the time he was ten, he had put together a bicycle from parts that had been thrown away. He did the same with a used car when he was sixteen. He worked on it day and night until the car was as good as new.

As an engineer, my father was proud of the buildings he had constructed over the years. To me, none of these could match the little things he made just for me with his two hands. I was almost seven when my family bought a house in Melaka. My father insisted on extending the already perfectly adequate kitchen – we all wondered why. To my mother, the house was in a move-in condition. All she wanted was to celebrate the New Year in our new home and she thought we just needed some lovely decorations.

One day, my father and I walked by a store. We saw in the window the most charming doll's house. "Oh, Daddy," I said, "Isn't it beautiful? Do you think I can get it for my birthday?"

He looked at the price tag. "Sorry, dear. It's too expensive. Maybe one day, sweetheart." He told me how, as a boy, he had wanted a cart but he never got one. My father probably hoped I would stop thinking about the doll's house but I drove my parents crazy by talking about it all the time.

Later, I asked him, "Why didn't you buy the cart? Was it expensive too? What did you do then?"

"I made my own from wooden pieces and old wheels," he said.

"But I don't know how to make a doll's house."

"We'll make one together," he assured me. Right after my birthday, we started working on it. Night after night, Dad would come home tired from his job, yet he would always find time to work with me on the doll's house. This went on for four months but that doll's house was the greatest gift a child could ever ask for. The experience is still fresh in my memory even though it has been so long *lin* since I played with the doll's house. I still occasionally bring it down from the attic just to admire it and remember those months I watched my father bring my dream to life.

Years later, I went off to college in Kuala Lumpur. I suddenly had to rely on myself to change a light bulb or fix a leaky tap. At first, I wished that my father was around but as I became more skilful at small projects, I finally realised that he had been preparing me for this day.

I went back to my parents' home one day and went up to my room. There, in the afternoon light, stood my doll's house. I turned to find my father standing at the doorway. "Oh, Daddy, it's still beautiful." He came in, put his arm around me, and whispered, "When you have your own home, you can take it with you."

"Dad, I'm never going to leave you."

"But I expect you to," he answered. "I can build a lot of things but I can't build your life. All I can do is to prepare you for your future."
