Answer **all** questions.

1 (a) *When Jesus saw how much faith they had, he said to the man, “Your sins are forgiven, my friend.” The teacher of the Law and the Pharisees began to say to themselves, “Who is this man who speaks blasphemy!”* (Luke 5:20-21a)

(i) Who was this man that Jesus spoke to? [1 mark]

(ii) Why was Jesus accused of blasphemy when he said, “Your sins are forgiven, my friend”? [1 mark]

(iii) How did Jesus respond to the accusation? [3 marks]

(b) *He (the Lord) said to them (the disciples), “There is a large harvest, but few workers to gather it in. Pray to the owner of the harvest that he will send our workers to gather in his harvest. Go! I am sending you like lambs among the wolves.”* (Luke 10:2-3)

(i) What does the harvest refer to? [1 mark]

(ii) How many disciples did the Lord send out? [1 mark]

(iii) Mention two things that the Lord told the disciples not to bring along when they were sent out. [1 mark]

(iv) Why did Jesus tell the disciples not to bring these things? [2 marks]

(c) *Then Jesus told them this parable: “There was once a rich man who had land which bore good crops. He began to think to himself, ‘I haven’t anywhere to keep all my crops. What can I do?’”* (Luke 12:16-17)

(i) What led Jesus to tell this parable? [1 mark]

(ii) What two actions did the rich man decided to take? [2 marks]

(iii) According to this parable, what did God call the rich man and why? [2 marks]

(d) *Jesus said, "All this you (Jesus' disciples) see – the time will come when not a single stone here will be left in its place; every one will be thrown down."* (Luke 21:5b-6)

(i) What led Jesus to say this? [2 marks]

(ii) State two questions the disciples asked in response to what Jesus said. [2 marks]

(iii) Identify one specific future event that Jesus was referring to. [1 mark]

2 (a) *Jesus said to them, "The times and occasions are set by my Father's own authority, and it is not for you to know when they will be. But when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, \_\_\_\_\_"* (Acts 01:7-8a)

(i) Where was Jesus when He said this? [1 mark]

(ii) Complete what Jesus said. [3 marks]

(iii) What happened to Jesus after this conversation? [1 mark]

(b) *But with his wife's agreement he kept part of the money for himself and handed the rest over to the apostles.* (Acts 05:02)

(i) Name the husband and wife. [1 mark]

(ii) Where did they get the money? [1 mark]

(iii) Explain briefly the motive of their actions. [2 marks]

(iv) Finally, what happened to them. [1 mark]

(c) *They disputed what Paul was saying and insulted him. But Paul and Barnabas spoke out even more boldly: "It was necessary that the word of God should be spoken first to you. But since you rejected it and do not consider yourselves worthy of eternal life, we will leave you and go to the Gentiles."* (Acts 13:45b-46)

(i) 'You' in the context above, refers to \_\_\_\_\_. [1 mark]

(ii) What was the Gentiles' response to the words spoken above? [1 mark]

(iii) Name another city where Paul said he would turn to the Gentiles. [1 mark]

(iv) Comment on Paul's ability to speak out even more boldly when faced with disputes and insults. [2 marks]

*(d) There is the danger, then, that this business of ours will get a bad name. Not only that, but there is also the danger that the temple of the great goddess Artemis will come to mean nothing and that her greatness will be destroyed – the goddess worshipped by everyone in Asia and in all the world! (Acts 19:27)*

(iii) What business were they doing? [1 mark]

(iv) Why was their business getting a bad name? [2 marks]

(ii) How Jesus proved to his disciples in Jerusalem that he was alive, including what he said to them [10 marks]

(b) What was the significance of the appearance of Jesus? [2 marks]

6 (a) Give an account of the conversion of Saul (Paul) on the road to Damascus. [13 marks]

(b) How did Paul's conversion contribute to the growth of the early church? [2 marks]

7 (a) Why did Paul go over to Macedonia during his second missionary journey? [2 marks]

(b) Give an account of Paul's visit to Thessalonica in Macedonia. Include the attack on Jason. [13 marks]

8 (a) Give an account of Paul's trial before Governor Festus when he appealed to the Roman Emperor. [11 marks]

(b) State two other occasions where Paul claimed his rights as a Roman citizen. [4 marks]
