(i) What did the angel of the Lord say to the shepherds? [3 marks]

(ii) What is the significance of the shepherd being chosen to receive this message? [2 marks]

(b) Jesus asked, "Who touched me?" (Luke 8:45a)

(i) Describe the person who touched Jesus. [2 marks]

(ii) What did the person do after having been found out? [2 marks]

(iii) What did Jesus say to the person who had touched him? [1 mark]

(c) Jesus answered them, "Do your best to go in through the narrow door; because many people will surely try to go in but will not be able." (Luke 13:23b-24)

(i) What was the question that led Jesus to say this? [1 mark]

(ii) What do you think the **narrow door** symbolises? [2 marks]

(iii) Explain what Jesus meant when He said that **many people will surely try to go in but will not be able**. [2 marks]

(d) He went into the presence of Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. (Luke 23:52)

(i) Name this person who asked for the body of Jesus. [1 mark]

(ii) State two things about this person. [2 marks]

(iii) What did he do with the body of Jesus? [2 marks]

2 (a) "How stubborn **you** are!" Stephen went on to say. "How heathen your hearts, how deaf you are to God's message! You are just like your ancestors; you too have always resisted the Holy Spirit!" (Acts 7:51)
