- (b) (Jesus said), "If one of you is planning to build a tower, he sits down first and works out what it will cost, to see if he has enough money to finish the job." (Luke 14:28)
- (i) Give the consequence of not being able to finish building the tower. [2 marks]
- (ii) What is the lesson that Jesus wants us to learn from the example above? [1 mark]
- (iii) Following this, what was the other example Jesus gave that has the same message? [2 marks]
