Answer **all** questions.

1 (a) *(An angel of the Lord said,) “He will go ahead of the Lord, strong and mighty like the Prophet _____. He will bring fathers and children together again; he will turn disobedient people back to the way of thinking of the righteous; ...”* (Luke 1:17)

- (i) Who does “He” in the text above refer to? [1 mark]
- (ii) Which prophet is this person likened to? [1 mark]
- (iii) Where were these words spoken? [1 mark]
- (iv) Mention two other things that the angel said about him. [2 marks]

(b) *As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, “Master, how good it is that we are here! We will make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.”* (He did not really know what he was saying.) (Luke 9:33)

- (i) Name another person who was also present at this event. [1 mark]
- (ii) Mention the changes that happened to Jesus before these words were spoken. [2 marks]
- (iii) What do Moses and Elijah represent? [2 marks]

(c) *When Jesus saw her, he called out to her, “Women, you are free from your illness!” He placed his hands on her, and at once she straightened herself up and praised God.* (Luke 13:12-13)

- (i) What was the cause of her illness? [1 mark]
- (ii) How many years had she been ill? [1 mark]
- (iii) The official of the synagogue was angry with Jesus’ actions. Why was he angry? [1 mark]
- (iv) What did Jesus then say to the official? [2 marks]

(d) *But Jesus saw through their trick and said to them, "Show me a silver coin. Whose face and name are these on it?" (Luke 20:23-24)*

(i) Who were trying to trick Jesus? [1 mark]

(ii) What was their reply to Jesus' question? [1 mark]

(iii) What else did Jesus say in this incident? [1 mark]

(iv) Comment on the wisdom that Jesus showed in handling their trickery. [2 marks]

2 (a) *Then they prayed, "Lord, you know the thoughts of everyone, so show us which of these two you have chosen to serve as an apostle in the place of Judas, who left to go to the place where he belongs." (Acts 1:24-25)*

(i) Name the two men. [2 marks]

(ii) What qualifications did these two men have in common? [2 marks]

(iii) Mention the method used to choose between the two men after they prayed. [1 mark]

(b) *For the Holy Spirit had not yet come down on any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then Peter and John placed their hands on them, and they received the Holy spirit. Simon (the magician) saw that the Spirit had been given to the believers when the apostles placed their hands on them. (Acts 8:16-18)*

(i) Where did this incident take place? [1 mark]

(ii) What did Simon the magician do and say when he saw the believers receive the Holy spirit? [2 marks]

(iii) State Peter's response to Simon the magician. [2 marks]

(c) *Barnabas wanted to take John Mark with them, but Paul did not think it was right to take him, ... (Acts 15:37-38)*

(i) What did John Mark do that caused Paul not to take him with them? [1 mark]

(ii) What happened after this? [2 marks]

(iii) Who do you think made a better decision, Paul or Barnabas? Give a reason to support your answer. [2 marks]

(d) *But the ship hit a sandbank and went a ground; ... The soldiers made a plan to kill all the prisoners. (Acts 27:41-42)*

(i) How many people were on board the ship? [1 mark]

(ii) Why did the soldiers plan to kill all the prisoners? [1 mark]

(iii) The army officer on board the ship stopped this plan. Why? [1 mark]

(iv) Finally, how did everyone on board manage to get safely ashore? [2 marks]

3 (a) Narrate the parable of the Great Feast. [13 marks]

(b) Mention a lesson that can be learnt from this parable. [2 marks]

4 (a) Describe the things that Jesus said would happen before the Son of Man comes again with great power and glory. [9 marks]

(b) What words of encouragement did Jesus give his disciples over the persecution they would face? [3 marks]

(c) List the warnings that Jesus gave his disciples as they wait for his second coming. [3 marks]

5 (a) Give an account of the crucifixion of Jesus at the place called “The Skull”. [13 marks]

(b) Explain the significance of Jesus’ death. [2 marks]

6 (a) Describe what happened to Peter after his arrest by King Herod and how he was miraculously brought out from prison. [13 marks]

(b) State a lesson learnt from this incident. [2 marks]

7 (a) Give an account of Paul in Corinth where he met a Jewish couple, including his ministry there and his vision. [13 marks]

(b) Mention two other occasions when Paul had a vision. [2 marks]

8 (a) Give an account of the plot to kill Paul and how Commander Claudius Lysias found out about it. [13 marks]

(b) Commander Claudius Lysias later helped Paul by sending him to Caesarea. Mention another example where believers were also helped out of danger. [2 marks]
